<p>Emissions Substances that leak out or are left over after production, transport or other processes, like exhaust fumes from a car or soot from a factory chimney.</p>		
<p>Global Warming A gradual increase in the average temperature of the Earth's atmosphere and its oceans due to the presence of gases that trap heat that would otherwise escape from the atmosphere.</p>		
<p>Methane A colourless, flammable gas made up of hydrogen and carbon that can be burned as fuel. Released as a by-product when organic matter decomposes. Considered a natural gas.</p>		
<p>Fossil Fuel A fuel (like coal, oil or natural gas) formed in the Earth from plants and animal remains.</p>		
<p>Greenhouse Gases A gas in Earth's atmosphere that absorbs heat and traps that heat in the atmosphere. Examples include water vapour, carbon dioxide and methane.</p>		
<p>Freons One of many gases or liquids used in refrigerators and aerosol sprays, which have been found to contribute to global warming.</p>		
<p>Flatulent Having gaseous build up in the digestive system, which leads to passing gas.</p>		



<p>Solar Radiation All of the light and energy that comes from the sun, including the light that we see and the heat that we feel.</p>
