

Prodigy: Instructions for Parents

Step 1: Create a Prodigy Account

- 1) Visit the Prodigy website: www.prodigygame.com
- 2) Click on the "Get Started For Free" button.
- 3) Sign up for a parent account by providing your email address and creating a password.

Step 2: Add Your Child's Account

- 1) Log in to your parent account using the email and password you just created.
- 2) After logging in, you'll be prompted to add your child's account. Click on the "Add Child" button.
